In this clinic you received instructions on how and why

Trestles are built

Beginning with the type of stain you apply and how dark you desire is all a personal preference.



The "bent" on the left was stained using Acrylic Black & water. The "bent" on the right was stained using India Ink & Alcohol.

Also, Steve prefers using 3/16" basswood while Ron prefers using 1/4" stock; yet both model in the same scale ("O").





First Stop was to visit Terry Ross' HO scale layout

Terry & his wife provided drinks & donuts in their Den, thus allowing the 25 of us folks to circulate through the layout room. The layout is a double-decker with a helix and is DC powered. He went on to explain his concept of lift-out scenery: because it is easier to build on a table-top than it is to build

in place. 15 different rock molds were used, plus using foam to vary the appearance. Terry explained that his layout is over 25 years old and was designed with his sons - each one had the "run" of their own mainline.
















The Helix is made of half circles - making 5 coils - and according to Jim Marlett (who actually timed

it) the trains take approximately one minute at 2.72 percent incline.












three-car garage. His layout includes an impressive array of operating signals in active use, plus a densely populated (more than 25 locomotives) rail yard.


